



Choirs £10,000 fight to save Sacristan Sean Heffernan organ

SALLYNOGGIN music enthusiasts are asking their neighbours to invest in their community's future — to the tune of £10,000.

Singers in the choir Victories parish are fighting to put new life into their valuable church organ, which is in need of vital repairs.

And while they aren't looking forward to the sheer slog of raising £10,000 they are determined to make the effort because once they succeed music lovers can relax ... for the next 300 years.

"We've been told that if we get this work done the organ will be good for another 300 years", explains Angela Lambert from the choir. "It's really an investment in the parish's future."

The instrument was hand-made during the 1840s by John White and Company for a private home and the church bought in for £50 around 1955.

"It isn't really strong enough for the church

and doesn't encourage based at Our Lady of the congregation to Victories parish are join in the singing at all", admits Angela. "But if extra pipework and so on is added and all the pieces will also have to be made by hand — it will be transformed."

> The group are starting off their fund-raising on April 1 with a silver brass band concert in the church.

"That's one experiment and we're also thinking of arranging a sponsored slim-in over Lent", she continues. "It's going to be very hard work raising that amount of money and, being realistic, I think it will take us two years to do it.

"I joined the choir for some relaxation and now I find myself in the middle of all this!" she adds wryly. "But it would be such a shame to let this go -



we have to make the effort!"
