#### The Gift of Presence

Maximilian Kolbe, a Franciscan priest, was arrested by the Gestapo in February 1941. In May of that year he was transferred to Auschwitz. There he quickly won himself a reputation for dedication to the needs of his fellow prisoners.

Towards the end of July a prisoner escaped from the camp. The camp commander was furious and declared that ten of his companions should die in his place. He lined up the prisoners and went down the line picking out ten men at random. The tenth man to be chosen broke down and pleaded for mercy, saying that he had a wife and young family to support at home. At this point Maximilian Kolbe stepped forward and offered to take his place. After some hesitation the commander agreed and the substitution was made.

The ten prisoners were left to starve to death in an underground bunker as a deterrent to would-be escapers. In the days that followed, the guards watched through a peep-hole the agony of the dying men. They saw the men gathered around Fr. Kolbe. At times they could be seen joking, at other times praying and singing hymns. Fourteen days went by. One by one they died. Last to die was Fr. Kolbe. On the night of August 14th he was still alive. A guard put an end to his agony by forcibly administering a lethal injection of carbolic acid to him.

The man whose place Fr. Kolbe took survived the camps. Later he stated, 'At first I felt terrible at the thought of letting another man die in my place. But then I realised that he had done this, not so much to save my life, as to be with the other nine in their last terrible agony. His nearness to them in those dreadful last hours was worth more than a lifetime of preaching.'

True love goes beyond the giving of gifts. It requires the giving of oneself. Maximilian Kolbe might have given those men advice and encouragement. He might have visited them in their death cell. But his presence with them was worth more than anything else, even though he wasn't able to save them from their cruel fate.

What Kolbe did was an astonishing act of love. St. John says 'The Word was made flesh, and lived among us.' This is a great mystery of love. In Jesus, the only Son of the Father, we have Brother who loves us to the extent that he came among us and shared our lives to the full. Not only did he share our lives, but he also shared our death.

### **Ordinary Time**

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word ordinalis, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word ordo, from which we get the English word order. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) nor in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ - a period of 33 or 34 weeks.

Ordinary Time refers to all of those parts of the Catholic Church's liturgical year that aren't included in the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. Ordinary Time thus encompasses two different periods in the Church's calendar, since the Christmas season immediately follows Advent, and the Easter season immediately follows Lent.

Green vestments and altar cloths have traditionally been associated with the time.

Branches of the Association meet, pray and chat. The groups normally meet once a month sometimes after Mass to make it easy to attend.


