Why is it that sometimes when a person hears words that hurt him he can let them pass by without any bother as if he had not heard them, whilst at other times, as soon as he hears them he is troubled and upset. The question is - what is the cause of this difference? Is there one reason for this or are there many? There are probably several, but there is one in particular which is the source of all the others, as the saying goes: it results from the state of mind that the person is in at that particular time.

For example, when someone is caught as he comes from prayer or contemplation, he is then in the best of dispositions and is able to put up with his brother and remain undisturbed. It may be that he has great affection for the other and so, out of love, puts up patiently with everything. But it can also happen that he despises the one who wants to upset him, regarding him as the lowest of men and not worth even a reply. Nor would he even consider mentioning his slights and insults to someone else.

The brother who insults us may upset us either because we are not at that moment in the right mood or because we dislike him intensely. There are many other reasons as well which are described in different ways. But, if we examine the matter closely, we can say that the reason for all disturbance is that no one blames himself.

This is the reason for every taking of offence and upset. This is why at times it is impossible to find peace of soul. Nor should we be surprised at this, since it is the teaching of spiritual men that there is no other way of peace for us. This we can see to be true in so many people. And yet we hope for peace but do not follow their teaching. Or, we believe that we are on the right path while we are irritated by everything and cannot bear to take any blame upon ourselves.

That is the way things are. A man may indeed accomplish innumerable good deeds, but if he does not master this he will never attain peace. Instead, he will always oppress himself and oppress others and his labours will go for nothing.



The Sisters of Mercy will shortly bid farewell to the Rehabilitation Hospital on Rochestown Ave.

The National Rehabilitation Hospital as it is known today can trace its beginnings back to 1916 when it a private residence called "The Cedars". The house along with 60 acres of land, was acquired by the Reverend Mother M. Malachy of the Sisters of Mercy. The Hospital grounds incorporated a farm and the purchase of a portion of land known as "Wood Park" in 1942 helped to provide fresh vegetables for the patients and pasture for the livestock. Originally the hospital catered for TB patients. When the eradication of TB was imminent Sisters saw the need for the provision of the rehabilitation services. They undertook further training and recruited specialist rehabilitation In 1961, the hospital reopened to provide specialist adult and paediatric rehabilitation services for patients from throughout Ireland.

We wish the Sisters well in this new chapter of their lives and thank them for their service to our Community over the years.
