How God's Help Comes

There was a bad flood and the cellar of Thomas' house filled up with water. A man came by in a canoe and said, 'Do you want a lift to safety?' 'No,' said Thomas. 'I have faith in God. He will save me.'

The water rose and flooded the ground floor. Thomas was forced to got upstairs. A man came by in a motor boat and offered to take him to safety, but Thomas said, 'I have faith in God. He will save me.'

The water rose higher still and Thomas had to take to the roof. A helicopter came by and the pilot offered to take him to safety. But once again Thomas declined, saying, 'I have faith in God. He will save me.' And he sat there waiting for God.

But the water continued to rise and he drowned. On arriving in heaven he said angrily to God, 'I had faith in you, and still you let me drown.' To which God replied, 'Not once, but three times, I sent you help, and each time you refused it.'

We don't always recognise God's help when it comes. Prayer is answered not in God doing things for us, but in God helping us to do things for ourselves and for one another. We will wait in vain for a heavenly angel. But God sends us human angels. All of us have experienced the ministry of such angels.

And we also get opportunities to be such and angel to someone in distress. Sometimes it may mean doing something, providing some basic service such as a hot meal. Other times it may mean saying a word of encouragement. Still other times it may mean just being there beside someone, providing a comforting presence, so that the person doesn't have to suffer alone.

Many people go through a bad period. It is only the care of some human angel that helps them get through it.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German Lutheran pastor who was executed by the Nazis for resisting Hitler's totalitarian regime, left a rich theological legacy. One of his books, *The Cost of Discipleship*, is considered a classic of Christian thought. In it, he distinguishes between "cheap grace" and "costly grace." "Cheap grace," he wrote, "is the grace we bestow on ourselves...grace without discipleship. Costly grace is the grace which must be sought again and again. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is go

August 26th is the day of the Pope's Mass in the Phoenix Park. There will be some adjustment to Sunday



Everything is a Love Letter from God "God has written a precious book, 'whose letters are the multitude of created things present in the universe'. No

"God has written a precious book, 'whose letters are the multitude of created things present in the universe'. No creature is excluded from this manifestation of God. 'From panoramic vistas to the tiniest living form, nature is a constant source of wonder and awe. It is also a continuing revelation of the divine." (Canadian Bishops' Conference) [LS 85]

Notice what Pope Francis is saying here - that the first Creation is already a spe-

cial story about God, a precious book in which every page, every creature, is a revelation of the divine Creator. He is saying that God was already in the world from the beginning of its existence, long before the coming of Jesus into our world at the first Christmas. He believes that Creation itself is a central part of the

Christian story. It will be helpful for all of us to get a clearer glimpse of this revelation - that Creation itself is the first love letter from our Parent-God - the first Bible, the first glimpse of our divine Mother, her first incarnation. It is an insight we need to grasp if we are ever to be touched by what our Pope has in his heart

for our enlightenment and nourishment.

"Acknowledging the intrinsic value and beauty of creation ... is a major paradigm shift for most Western and cultural Christians," writes Richard Rohr. "We limited God's love and salvation to our own human species and even then to only certain 'chosen' people ... All you have to do today is walk outside and gaze at one leaf, long and lovingly, until you know, really know, that this leaf is a participation in the eternal being of God."


