The Little Way St Thérèse of Lisieux

One day, Mother Agnes asked her what was the exact nature of the Way she desired to teach to souls after her death. "It is the way of Spiritual childhood, the way of confidence and abandonment to God. I want to teach them the little means which have proved so perfectly successful for myself. I want to tell them that there is only one thing for us to do here below: to throw at Jesus' feet the flowers of little sacrifices, to win Him through our caresses. That is the way in which I have taken hold of Him, and that is why I shall get such a good welcome".

A few days later, having been asked what she meant by remaining a little child, she replied: "It means that we acknowledge our nothingness; that we expect everything from the good Lord, as a child expects everything from its father; it means to worry about nothing, not to build upon fortune; it means to remain little, seeking only to gather flowers, the flowers of sacrifice, and to offer them to the good Lord for His pleasure. It also means not to attribute to ourselves the virtues we practice, not to believe that we are capable of anything, but to acknowledge that it is the good Lord who has placed that treasure in the hand of His little child that He may use it when He needs it, but it remains always God's own treasure. Finally, it means that we must not be discouraged by our faults, for children fall frequently".



Young people are not

a problem to be solved

Renowned Catholic speaker David Wells has said that the Church in Ireland must not view young people merely as "a problem to be solved". Wells, a UK catechist who regularly talks at conferences around the world, was speaking ahead of the Engage Youth Ministry Conference in Dublin on 8th December 2018. Churches throughout the Western world "are failing at a parish level and it's just not working for young people", he



continued. What is needed, Wells said, "is a new theology of accompanying young people", which requires "free and cheerful missionaries" who understand that "a joyful church will attract young people anyway".

The best way of doing this is to start a process of accompanying young peo-

ple on their faith journeys. The Church must "rethink what we're actually asking in terms of parish. We must help clergy to get to grips with the whole idea of accompaniment. It's not a new thing, it's not a new initiative. This is exactly what Pope Francis is asking of us," continued Wells. Key to getting

this right, though, is ensuring that "we get to grips with the notion that we're not looking for fully fledged Catholics right from the beginning of the process. We must look to small signs of progress instead". Invariably this means investment in better training and developing a more incisive strategy.

"Most of all, young people want to know that they are loved and loveable, and that there is a role for them in the Church today. This is where true meaning comes from."
