### **Out of his Fullness**

This weeks Gospel story gives us a marvellous image of the loving relationship we have with God through Jesus. Jesus has come to claim us as God's own, and he is generous in the gifts he brings. There



is nothing mean about Jesus in the story: not a thimbleful of plonk, but gallons of the stuff! Luke has the same point in his Gospel: "Can the wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is still with them?" (5:34). It is not the time of fast, but the time of feast. And the feast is generous: "out of his *fullness* have we all received" (Jn. 1:16).

Of course the ultimate generosity of Jesus is shown when he dies for the love he has - when the bridegroom lays down his life for his bride. Jesus gives his whole self in love. He gives us his body and blood in this Eucharist - so that we can be united with him and with our Father. So, let us rejoice today that we know the name of the bridegroom and that he know our name in love.



# **Mothers of the Church**

In its fifth month, the Mothers of the Church initiative is part of a collaboration with the Kilmore Diocese and a newly established private association of the faithful called The Apostolate of the Returning King. Geared to all women, the program serves as both a personal development course and also a preparation for women to take a more active, and ultimately a more formal, role in Kilmore Diocese.

The initial formation program will run for two years, with nine meetings per year.



The group meets for two hours every month, followed by tea and coffee. The material assists women, whether biological mothers or not, in understanding the obligations and possibilities of their maternal offering to society and to the Church by building identity, healthy boundaries, and balanced spirituality. Currently, over 50 women are enrolled in Kilmore, 44

from the diocese and others attending from different areas. Additionally, hundreds of women from Ireland, Europe, and the United States are enrolled and active through an online platform. Women participate either alone or in groups in their parishes, families, or homes.

Through the Mothers of the Church formation program, women learn how to 'mirror'

others accurately and positively and build confidence around listening skills and conflict resolution. "Bishop O'Reilly welcomed participants and thanked them for assembling," said Kathryn Clarke, who created the program. "It meant a great deal to the group. They could see that they were valued." In the course, participants learn to identify their physical, sexual, spiritual, and psychological boundaries, as well as become equipped to convey this important information to others.
