FISHERS OF MEN



Night-time was the time for fishing. If anyone else had said to Peter, 'Launch out into the deep and let down the net for a catch,' he would have said, 'Are you mad? Do you want me to make a fool of myself in front of all these other fishermen? If we didn't catch anything during the night, what chance have we of catching anything in broad daylight?'

But when Jesus said those words to Peter, his spontaneous response was, 'Lord, we fished all night long and caught nothing. But if you say so, I will let down the net.'

For Peter, the word of Jesus was different from the word of anyone else. It carried an authority which no other word of anyone else. Hence, if Jesus called for it, then no matter how hopeless the situation might seem, or how tired he was, or how foolish he might appear, he would try again.

How many people are there whose word we would take seriously? Whose word we would trust so absolutely? Whose word we would completely rely on? The answer is, 'Very few.'

The Gospel story is not so much a story about fishing, but about trust. Jesus was calling Peter and his companions to a more important occupation. He was offering them a cause to which to dedicate their lives. Jesus called the apostles, to to service of himself, but to service of others.

The Lord still calls people, and the need is just as great today. And there are still those who respond. But by our baptism we too are called to follow Christ. But what does the following of Christ mean for the ordinary person? It means to be a Christian where you are and in your chosen profession. There are more ways than one of serving Christ and his Gospel.

The 'How'

The attention of the PPC is focused on what it is doing, the task at hand. But no less important than the 'what' is the 'how'. I refer here to how the PPC is as a group; the ethos, the quality of relationships, the spirit and the spirituality. It is far more likely that this 'how' will be neglected than the 'what'. It can even be completely missed. And yet, if the 'how' is not right, the 'what' will struggle, and the group will find it hard to be effective. Ideally, what is being set out here should



be addressed right from the beginning when the group is being set up. It is an essential part of the group's formation. It sets the right tone from the start. It sets the expectations that the group has of itself as a group. It

is quite difficult to address these issues later on, when bad habits may have been picked up and poor ways of relating may have set in.

A good question to begin with is this; is the PPC a team or a committee? The word

'council' suggests a committee, like the city council or the county council. A committee works through meetings, with an agenda and procedures and voting and so on. 'Team', as in a football team, suggests something quite different. There are as few meetings as possible; the real action takes place elsewhere. We tend to think of the PPC as a committee. But we would do well to think of it less as a committee and more as a team. Obviously it is a bit of both.
