

The Holy Spirit's Role in the Church

The Church is now the messianic community who lives the life of Christ today in the power of the Holy Spirit on its pilgrim journey through this world. Following on from Baptism, the gift of the Holy Spirit given at Confirmation prepares the People of God to be 'prophets,' and witness publically to God in the world. Like Christ the Messiah, they are called to proclaim freedom to those who are enslaved

to a life separated from God and others. The charisms of the Spirit such as the gifts of teaching, prophecy and healing build up Church communities and yet the ultimate charism is charity: God's own love in us expressed in unity.

It is the Holy Spirit who continually keeps the Church alive in Christ. The Church's task is not simply to hand on a historical set of beliefs, sayings and commandments given by Christ and the Christian community at a point in history. Rather it

is the Spirit who keeps the Word of God alive and active in the Church today to change our lives. To live in the Spirit is to live a life of freedom by the power and grace of God. It is a gift for living Christian faith amidst life's ups and downs and to begin each day anew more like Christ, who is by nature what we are by adoption - a child of the Father. Through the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives, God's promise is fulfilled: 'I will not leave you orphans' and 'I am with you until the end of the age'.


