### The Miracle of Change

Before the coming of the Spirit, the apostles were virtually living in hiding in the upper room. A great task had been entrusted to them, yet they had neither the strength nor the will to begin it. But after Pentecost they were changed people.

What was it that the Holy Spirit did to them, and how did the miracle of change come about? Even though we are dealing with mystery, that doesn't mean we can't understand anything about it.

We have to realise that the apostles were wounded people. They were wounded by doubt and grief, by fear and failure, and above all by a sense of inadequacy. This helps us to understand something of what happened to the apostles. But after the coming of the Spirit they were changed people. They left their hiding place, and set out courageously to preach the Gospel.

We mustn't think that the change was affected in an instant. It had to be a gradual thing, a growth process. And growth can be slow and painful. We do not easily let go of old habits and attitudes.

People change when they are given hope, we need someone to awaken us to what is inside us. Someone who will bid us live, and help us grow. For the followers of Jesus, that someone is the Holy Spirit. The power that changed the apostles is available to us too, the gentle power of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit awakens us to the mysterious power within us, bids us live, and helps us grow. The poet Pablo Neruda said: 'I want to do with you what spring does with the cherry trees.' That's what the Spirit does.



Jesus introduces us to the real God Jesus' use of 'Abba' was a characteristic feature of his prayer and he wanted to

make of our whole life a constant sharing in his prayer to the Father. And that would lead to radical social and interpersonal consequences as we see in the 'Our Father' prayer (Mt 6:9; Lk 11:2), the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 5–7) and the commandment to love our neighbour (Mk 12:30-31). To really understand God as Father we have to let Jesus introduce us into

what he meant. Otherwise, we are simply projecting our notions of fatherhood (which always have limitations) onto God. Already in the Old Testament it is clearly stated that God as such is not male. He is neither male nor female.

While we come to know God the Father through lesus, it is also true that our human

experience helps us to understand what Jesus reveals about him. Pope John Paul Il pointed out that when it comes to understanding the fatherhood of God as revealed by Jesus Christ we have to keep in mind our experience of both fatherhood and motherhood. It is true, then, that Jesus left us the language of 'Father' but

it is to be understood, experienced and believed in and through him. And he reveals both paternal and maternal dimensions of God. It is worth recalling how on earth, Mary is the one who best mirrored God the Father for Jesus. On the guestion of the 'almighty' God, it is important to remember that God's omnipotence is no abstract power. In God, omnipotence, creativity and mercy, love and justice all coincide. This means that in all situations God is working always on all these levels as it were.


