If life is a gift, then time is the vehicle by which it is delivered to us. Each day we live, we have at our disposal 24 hours - 1,440 minutes - 86,000 seconds... And every moment is a precious gift from God. Someone calculated how a typical lifespan of seventy years is spent:

Sleep - 23 years - 32.0%

Work - 16 years - 22.8%

Television - 8 years - 11.4%

Eating - 6 years - 8.6%

Travel - 6 years - 8.6%

Leisure - 4.5 years - 4.5%

Illness - 4 years - 5.7%

Dressing - 2 years - 2.8%

Religion - 0.5 years - 0.7%

I don't know if this estimate is accurate, but it does remind me that the ability to steward our time wisely is vital. Benjamin Franklin sagely observed, "Dost thou love life? Then do not squander time, for it is the stuff life is made of."

Just as with life itself, we have three options for how we use our time: we can waste it, spend it, or invest it by wise stewardship.

Time is a slippery commodity. You can't hold onto it, and you can't save it for future use. If you aren't prepared to allocate this moment, it is gone forever. Time is here for a moment, and then it's gone forever.

Time— however many years of it we have - is our opportunity to achieve success in life. But if we don't clearly identify what success looks like, we may come to the end of our lives only to realize that we lived for all the wrong goals.
