

Jesus and the Law

All of us are subject to law. Jesus himself was subject to law, both human and divine. As he grew up he obeyed Joseph and Mary. He obeyed the law of the land. And of course he obeyed the law of God. Here it is Jesus' attitude to the law of God that concerns us.



He found no fault with the law itself. His problem law with the way it was interpreted and applied by the religious leaders of his day. For Jesus it was not the letter of the law that mattered but the spirit of the law. The important thing is now how many commandments we obey, but the spirit in which we obey them.

The Pharisees only looked at the outward act. But God sees the heart. So Jesus said we have to look not just at our acts, but at our thoughts and desires.

Jesus saw that the commandments were interpreted in a very negative way which led to minimalism - doing the bare minimum. He interpreted them in a positive way. For example, the fifth commandment says, 'Thou shalt not kill.' but he said, 'you must love your neighbour.' He also saw obedience was rooted in fear and he wanted it rooted in love. His whole relationship with his heavenly Father was based on love. When you love someone, you avoid doing anything to hurt that person. Where there is love, there is really no need of law.
