Angels - Messengers from God

Angels - messengers from God - appear frequently in Scripture, but only three are named.

Michael appears in Daniel's vision as "the great prince" who defends Israel against its enemies. In the book of Revelation, Michael leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil. Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion.

Gabriel also makes an appearance in Daniel's visions, announcing Michael's role in God's plan. His best known appearance is when he appeared to Mary and she consented to be the mother of Jesus and then subsequently to Joseph urging him not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife.

Raphael's activity is confined to the Old Testament story of Tobit. There he guides Tobit's son, Tobiah, through a series of fantastic adventures that lead to a happy ending: Tobiah's marriage to Sarah, the healing of Tobit's blindness and the restoration of the family fortune.

Each of these archangels performs a different mission in Scripture. Michael protects; Gabriel announces and Raphael guides and heals.

And then we all have our own Guardian Angels, whose role is to represent us before God, to watch over us, to aid our prayer and to present our souls to God at death. Jesus said (Matt 18:10) "see that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father".
