

## Courage

There are two kinds of courage. The first is loud, angry and assertive. This is associated with the battlefield. The second is quiet, serene and unassertive. Even so, it is utterly unflinching and impervious to blandishments and threats.

We tend to think that fear and courage are mutually exclusive. But this is not so. Courage is not never being afraid. Courage is being afraid and overcoming it, or carrying on in spite of it. The conviction that one is doing the right thing gives one great strength. It means that we are acting out of the deepest goodness that is in us - out of the image of God within us.

Faith should be a great source of courage for us. It means that we rely on God rather than ourselves. Our strength comes from God.

Faith is a great support especially in times of trial, as we see from the example of the woman and her son (First Reading).

Belief in an afterlife is one of the most important of our beliefs as Christians. Without faith, life is a journey to nowhere. With faith, life is a journey to the promised land of eternal life.

The important thing is to live in communion with God. Death has lost its power over those who belong to God, because God is the God of the living not the dead. God is love, and dying means to go back to the universal and eternal source of love.




## In November we Remember
