
Parish Partnership

The Tempting of Jesus

That Jesus was tempted while in the wilderness there can be no doubt. The Letter to the Hebrews says that he was tempted 'in every way that we are, but was without sin' (4:15).



Take the first temptation. When the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command these stones and they will turn into bread', Jesus responded by saying, 'A human being does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.' This doesn't mean that Jesus wasn't concerned about hunger, he was well aware that while food is the first necessity of life, it is only the beginning. We eat in order to live, not the other way around.

He didn't come to provide ordinary bread. That we can provide for ourselves. He came to provide another kind of food - the food that only God can give us. His chief task was to nourish the minds and hearts of people with the bread of God's Word.

All of us who are struggling to live a good life can take heart from the example of Jesus. Resisting temptation was not easy for him; nor will it be for us. But in Jesus we have a brother who knows what we are up against. He forgives us when we fall and enables us to start again. He enables us to obey God's word, to trust in God and to worship God alone.
