A Hopeful Grieving

Grief follows the loss of a loved one as surely and naturally as night follows day. Grief is not an easy thing to handle. It is one of the strongest emotions we will ever experience. But, to grieve over the loss of a loved one is a good and necessary thing.

The way to deal with grief is not to run away from it, but to face it and work through it with as much courage and honesty as we can. Faith should not be used as a barrier against grief. Even Christ grieved. He wept at the death of his friend, Lazarus. Faith doesn't do away with the necessity of grieving. What it does do is enable us to grieve *with hope*.

Faith is a wonderful comfort and support at a time of death. Paul says, 'We believe that Jesus Christ died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Christ. Comfort one another with these thoughts'. To live fruitfully after the death of a loved one, people need to go through a period of grieving. But even though we may have tears in our eyes, we have hope in our hearts.

The wedding feast to which Jesus invites us will be all the more joyful for those who have walked through the dark valley of grief, and emerged with the lamp of love still burning brightly.

On Sundays November 5th, 12th and 19th we are taking a census of Mass attendance. Volunteers will conduct the count.

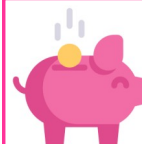
