A Quiet Space

Jesus 'made himself all things to all men' - to use St Paul's expression. Today's Gospel tells us how Jesus coped with all that pressure. It says after that busy Sabbath, he rose early next morning and went to a lonely place to pray. This was his customary practice. In the midst of the hectic activity which filled his days, he found time to withdraw by himself to lonely places.



What did the lonely place do for him? It enabled him to get some much needed rest. It helped him to keep focused on his mission. But, above all, it gave him time to pray. It was prayer that enabled him to maintain and foster the most important thing in his life - his relationship with his heavenly Father. That relationship was the ground beneath his feet all life long, and the secret of his successful ministry. Jesus entire ministry arose from his prayer and was sustained by it.
