Righteous Anger

The Gospel depicts an angry Jesus with a whip in his hand. This image doesn't sit well with the traditional image of the smiling Jesus. It seems to be so out of character with what we know of Jesus from the rest of the Gospels, that we might be tempted to dismiss it. It shows us that there was another side to Jesus' character. When the occasion demanded it he could be strong and assertive.

Still it comes as shock to see Jesus, not just angry, but furious. And to see him resort to what looks like a form of violence. We may have been taught that all anger is sinful. This is not necessarily the case. In itself anger is just a feeling, and neither good nor bad morally. Still there can be no denying that anger is a dangerous thing, and can result in us saying or doing things we later regret. But anger can also be a good thing. There are times when we ought to be angry. An unjust situation should make us angry. Anger can spur us to put right something that is blatantly wrong. In that case, anger is an expression of love.

To get back to the incident in the Temple. Jesus didn't get angry on his own account. His anger resulted from his love of God and of his neighbour. Religion had become narrow, nationalistic and exclusive. The Temple which was meant to be a house of prayer 'for all nations' was the preserve of the Jews. Jesus was doing away with the notion of exclusiveness. He was declaring that salvation was not just for the Jews but also for all peoples. And a final word about anger. While it has its uses, it is no resting place. We should heed the advice of Paul: 'do not let the sun go down on your anger' (Eph 4:26)
