God is Love

Love is a precondition for a true understanding of life and especially of God. Dostoevsky says, 'You must love all that God has created, both his entire world and every single tiny sand grain of it. If you love all things, you will also attain the divine mystery that is in all things.' Van Gogh said something similar, 'the best way to know God is to love many things. Love a friend, a wife, something, and you will be on the right way to knowing about God.'

Love is the best teacher we have. But it does not come of it's own accord. It is dearly bought. It often demands many years of persevering toil before we reach the point where we are able to love.

There is a big gap between knowing God and loving God. Not to love is not to know God. But when we love, the gap is closed. To love is to know God. Where love is God is, where God is love is. To know is not to prove, or to explain.

We are made in God's image. The image of God is at its best and brightest in us when we love. And each of us has an innate capacity for love. However, if this capacity is to be realised, the heart has to be right. If only the hear was right we could give so much more. But, alas, the heart is sometimes cold and unwelcoming, sometimes empty, and sometimes broken. We shouldn't be surprised at this. All it says is that we have a heart of flesh, not one of stone. But we have to heal the wounds of the heart in order to be able to produce the fruits of love.
