The Cup of Cold Water

Jesus said that anyone who gave one of his disciples even a cup of cold water would be rewarded. The 'cup of cold water' is a symbol of the small kind deed



Deeds don't have to be big but in order to be of help and comfort to the person for whom they are don. Small deeds are very important. They may not look much, but they create a friendly atmosphere.

It's not how much we do that matters, but how much love we put into what we do. The spirit in which a deed is done, the person to whom it is done, and the circumstances in which it is done, can magnify the effect of a small deed. A small deed can bring great comfort to a person provided it has a certain quality. That quality is *warmth*. All deeds that come from the heart have that quality.

Few of us a given the chance to perform great deeds. But the chance to give 'a cup of water' can come our way several times in the course of a day. A small act of kindness can turn winter into summer at least briefly for another person. It becomes a small but significant stepping-stone for that person.

Giving is at the heart of the Gospel. It is the very essence of Christianity. It is through giving that the heart remains open and one becomes a loving person.
