The Gifts of Hearing and Speech

The Gospel tells us how Jesus cured a Gentile man who was deaf and had a speech impediment. The ability to hear and the ability to speak are two great gifts, but like all gifts they can be taken for granted.

To be deaf is to be deprived of so much. Diminished hearing leads to embarrassed silences, misunderstandings and, and a sense of isolation. Few people bother to communicate with the deaf. Today hearing aids have lessened their pain but not removed entirely.

The gift of speech is our chief means of communicating with other people. People with speech impediments are often subject of fun and amusement to others.

We see the trouble Jesus went to on behalf of this poor man and the care he dealt with him. Hence it is no surprise that the ceremony of touching the ears and the tongue made its way into the rite of Baptism from early times, and is still there to this day. The minister touches the ears and mouth of the person being baptised. In doing so he says 'The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, the praise and glory of God the Father.'

We need to be able to hear the word of God. Then we need to be able to profess that word with our lips. Finally we need to put it into practice in our lives.
