I sought my God and my God I could not find;
I sought my soul and my soul eluded me;
I sought to serve my brother in his need, and I found all three
My God, my soul and thee.

How easy it is to separate the two great commandments; to think that we can have one without the other; that we can love God without loving our neighbour too.

The two commandments are essentially interrelated. True love of neighbour springs from the love of God; and on the other hand, there can be no true love of God which does not express itself in love of neighbour. This is better than all sacrifices. It's easy to let ritual take the place of love. Then we end up with a loveless religion.

Our greatest sin is not that we don't love our neighbours, but that we don't even know them. So how can we be neighbours to them in the Gospel sense? The worst thing of all is cold indifference.

Many people are caused problems by a particular person, be it a neighbour or a family member. What can we do? We should avoid any kind of retaliation - this only makes things worse. We should try to keep communicating, even if it's just a matter of saying 'good morning' or 'good evening'. Then we should pray for that person. If we can sincerely pray for a person, it will keep bitterness and hatred from accumulating in our hearts.


