The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph, Year C, 29th December, 2024. Bulletin No: 1548

The Holy Family

The events surrounding the conception and birth of Jesus marked him out as a special child with a unique destiny. He was the one through whom the promise to Abraham would be fulfilled. He would be the hope and comfort of Israel, and a light for the nations. But the Gospel also talks about the rejection of Jesus, a rejection which would cause a sword of sorrow to pierce Mary's heart. Parents share in the joys and sorrows of their children and vice versa.

There is no reason to believe that Mary and Joseph had a clear understanding of either the full identity or the great destiny of the Child Jesus. Nevertheless, in welcoming him into their lives, and in bringing him up in faith and love, they played their part in helping him to realise his destiny. The Gospel shows that at Nazareth they provided the kind of atmosphere in which he was able to grow to maturity.

Every child is a gift from God. And every child has a unique destiny. But that destiny is hidden from the parents. They wonder what will become of their children. Naturally they want the best for them. But all they can do is launch them on their way. Having given them life, they must allow them the freedom to live that life. Above all, they must be careful not to obstruct God's plan for them.

Ideally a family is a little community of love. The atmosphere in the home is all important. The atmosphere is determined by the quality of the relationships. Parents and children contribute to the making of that atmosphere.
