

Jesus says to us 'Love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you.' Love your enemies! We find it hard enough to love our friends, so how can we be expected to love our enemies?



Jesus is telling us to love, not to hate. We should not have hatred in our hearts for anyone, not even our enemies? When we hate, we expend more energy than in any other emotion. We must not dissipate our strength in hating but save it for better things.

It is not only for the sake of the enemy that Jesus says to us, 'Love your enemies', but for our own sake too. Hatred is a very destructive thing. Hatred may not destroy its object, but it will surely destroy the one who hates. 'Ten enemies cannot hurt a person as much as he hurts himself' (Proverb).

Jesus never said that we would have no enemies - there is no lack of realism here. But he offers us a new way of dealing with our enemies, a different way of responding that has the potential to break the endless cycle of retaliation.

Our hearts were made to love, not to hate. The power of love is greater than the power of evil. Love releases extraordinary energies in us. And love is never lost. If not reciprocated, it will flow back and soften and purify the heart. If we pray for our enemies, peace will come to us. And when we love our enemies, we can be certain that divine grace dwells in us.
