Parish Knitting Group

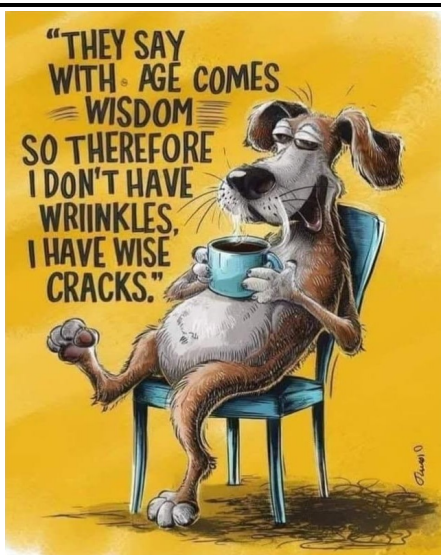

The Radiance of His Kindness

It's hard to underestimate the value of kindness - plain, ordinary, everyday kindness. When we look back on our lives, we remember with bitterness times we were treated harshly. But we recall fondly times we were treated kindly. Kindness is welcome at all times and in all situations. But it is like manna from heaven when one is vulnerable and exposed. In today's Gospel we hear a marvellous example of the kindness Jesus showed to someone who was exposed and vulnerable.

The incident could have ended horribly. But for Jesus the incident would in all probability, have ended up with the woman lying as a bleeding mass on the ground. Who would have benefitted from that? No one. All would have gone away diminished. Thankfully it ended very differently. No one died and all were taught a salutary lesson. Jesus illuminated a dark scene with the radiance of his kindness.

The lovely thing about a kindness done to us is that it continues to benefit us long afterwards, through the memory we have of it. It becomes a spring to which we can return, and which never fails to refresh us. When we treat another person kindly a sweetness falls like dew into our heart.
