We are pleased to announce the return of the Women's Breakfast after the summer break!



The Prophet as 'Troublemaker'

Jesus was a transparently good person We would have expected then that he would have been universally loved. Yet he stirred up so much hatred that he ended up being crucified. How could that happen? It happened because Jesus was a prophet, a religious prophet, and a prophet is always persona non grata to the powers-that-be. Most prophets are persecuted and some are killed.

Jeremiah is a good example. He was called to be a prophet from an early age. He lived out his vocation during a time of great turmoil, which saw the defeat of Israel and the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple. He was the conscience of his country. He loved his people dearly and never lost faith in the power of God to save them. Yet he was accused of being a troublemaker, and lived with constant threats to his life.

Jesus says he came to kindle a fire upon the earth. It's only an image, a metaphor. But it's a powerful one. Fire is not something one can remain indifferent to. It's not a weak, pale, lifeless thing. Fire warms and comforts. But it also burns up what is useless, and refines what is impure.

The Gospel message is fire, it is the leaven of the world. We the followers of Jesus, are the tenders of the fire.
