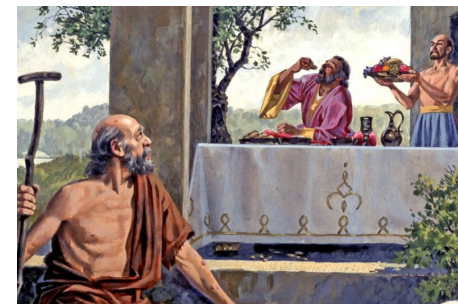

The Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus



Luke 16:19–31 presents a striking parable contrasting a rich man and a poor beggar named Lazarus. The rich man lives in luxury, while Lazarus suffers outside his gate, longing for scraps. When both die, their roles are reversed: Lazarus finds comfort with Abraham, and the rich man faces torment.

The story warns against indifference to human need. The rich man is condemned not for his wealth, but for ignoring Lazarus. His neglect reveals a lack of mercy and love. The parable also underscores the finality of judgment. The "great chasm" between comfort and torment cannot be crossed, and no second chances are given.

Finally, it stresses the sufficiency of God's word. When the rich man begs that his brothers be warned, Abraham replies that they already have Moses and the prophets. If they will not listen to Scripture, even a miracle will not persuade them.

This passage calls believers to compassion and responsibility. True faith is shown in how we respond to the poor and vulnerable. Earthly wealth is temporary, but eternal life depends on aligning our hearts with God's justice and mercy.
