The Greatness of Baptism

The ceremony of baptism is a beautiful one. In it we were formally given a name and welcomed into the family of God's people. Lovely prayers were said over us. Our body was signed with the sign of the cross, the mark of Christ's love for us. Water was poured over us. Water is the symbol of cleansing, and in baptism we are cleansed of sin. But it is more especially a symbol of life. In baptism we are given a share in the undying life of God.



Not once but twice our bodies were anointed with holy oil. Just as the bodies of athletes were smeared with oil to give them strength to compete, so we were anointed with holy oil to give us strength for the inevitable struggle against evil. And just as kings, prophets and priests were anointed with oil and thus marked out as God's ministers to the community, so we are anointed with the oil of chrism that we may be envoys of Christ in the world.



Our body was covered with a white garment, the outward sign of our Christian dignity. We were given a candle lighted from the Easter candle to signify the precious light of faith. God called us out of darkness into the wonderful light of his Son.



What happened at the baptism of Jesus happened at your baptism too. God called you by your name, and said, 'you are my beloved'. And the Spirit descended on you in order to help you in your life as a Christian.

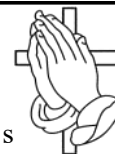
