
Registration for Confirmation And First Holy Communion





Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Year A, 18th January 2026. Bulletin No: 1602.

The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time invites us to reflect on how God reveals Himself in quiet and unexpected ways. In the Gospel, Jesus does not draw attention to Himself or make grand claims. Instead, He is identified by John the Baptist, who offers simple but profound testimony: "Behold, the Lamb of God." This reminds us that God often makes Himself known through the witness of others and through moments that may seem ordinary at first.



John calls Jesus the Lamb of God, a title filled with meaning. It points to sacrifice, mercy, and freedom from sin. From the beginning of His public ministry, Jesus is revealed as one who will give Himself completely for the sake of the world. His mission is not rooted in power or dominance, but in humility and love. He comes not to condemn humanity, but to carry its burdens and bring healing.

The first reading echoes this theme of mission and calling. God's servant is chosen not only for personal salvation, but to be a light to the nations. This reminds us that faith is never meant to be private or self-centred. Each of us, through baptism, is called to reflect God's light in our families, communities, and daily interactions.

Like John the Baptist, we may not have all the answers, but we are still called to point others toward Christ. Through our words, actions, and compassion, we quietly witness to the One who takes away sin and offers lasting hope to a waiting world.
