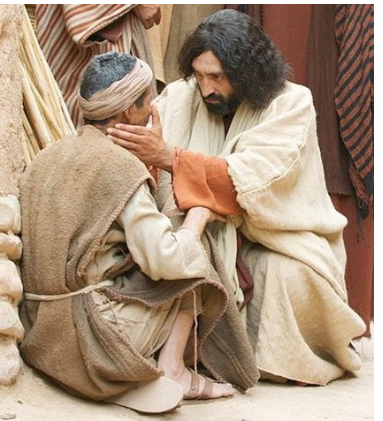

When Christ Opens Our Eyes

This week's Gospel centres on the healing of the man born blind. In this story, Jesus Christ restores physical sight, but the deeper message is about spiritual vision. While the blind man gradually comes to recognize who Jesus is, the religious leaders - who believe they see clearly - remain spiritually blind. The Gospel challenges us to ask an uncomfortable question: what might we be refusing to see in our own lives?



Lent is a journey from darkness into light. Often our blindness appears in subtle ways: prejudice, pride, indifference, or a reluctance to change. Like the Pharisees in the story, we can become so certain of our own understanding that we stop listening for God's voice. The healing in this Gospel reminds us that true sight is not only about knowledge but about humility and openness to transformation.

The man who was healed shows courage and honesty. He simply speaks the truth about what God has done for him, even when others doubt or challenge him. His witness reminds us that faith is not about having every answer but about recognizing God's work in our lives.

As we continue through Lent, let Christ open our eyes. When we allow his light to guide us, we begin to see ourselves, others, and the world with compassion, clarity, and renewed faith.

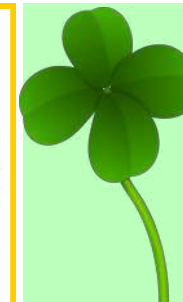
