A Call to New Life

The Fifth Sunday of Lent draws us into the powerful story of the raising of Lazarus, a moment that reveals both the humanity and the divinity of Jesus. Faced with the death of his friend, Jesus weeps. This simple act reminds us that grief, sorrow, and loss are not signs of weakness, but expressions of love. Even in knowing what he is about to do, Jesus fully enters into the pain of the moment.



Yet the story does not end in despair. Jesus calls Lazarus out of the tomb, showing that God's power reaches even into the places that seem most final and hopeless. This speaks directly to our own lives. We all experience moments that feel like tombs—times of fear, failure, or loss where hope seems buried.

The message of this Sunday is clear: God is not distant from those places. Instead, He calls us out of them, inviting us into new life. But like Lazarus, we must respond. We are called to listen for that voice and step forward, even when it feels uncertain.

As Lent nears its end, this reflection challenges us to trust more deeply. It invites us to believe that renewal is possible, and that no situation is beyond the reach of God's life-giving grace.
