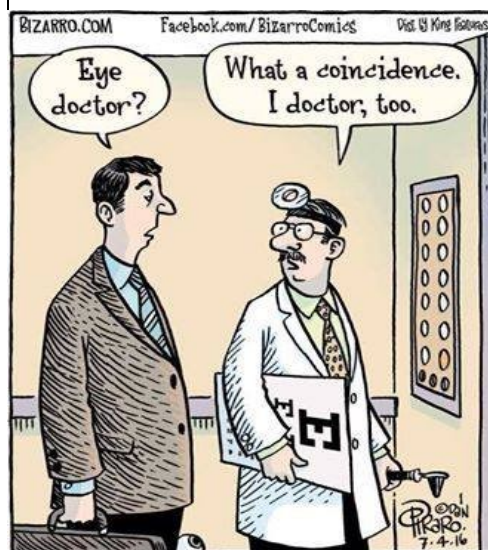
Shanganagh Cemetery Sunday

Sixth Sunday of Easter. Year A, 10th May 2026. Bulletin No: 1618..



On this the sixth Sunday of Easter we are reminded that love for Christ is proven not by emotion alone, but by faithful living. Jesus tells His disciples, "If you love me, keep my commandments." These words challenge a culture that often separates love from commitment. Jesus speaks of a relationship that transforms behaviour, shapes decisions, and draws us into deeper communion with God.



Christ also promises that we will not be left orphaned. The Holy Spirit remains with us, guiding, correcting, and strengthening us when faith becomes difficult. Many people search for peace through achievement, distraction, or control, yet the Spirit offers a different kind of peace rooted in God's presence. Even in uncertainty, suffering, or disappointment, we are never abandoned.

This Sunday encourages us to examine whether our faith is visible in daily life. Do our actions reflect patience, forgiveness, honesty, and compassion? Loving Christ means allowing His teachings to shape how we speak, work, and treat others.

The resurrection is not only a past event to celebrate; it is a living reality that calls us to hope. Because Christ lives, we are invited to live with courage, trust, and enduring faith. When we open our hearts to the Spirit, obedience becomes less about obligation and more about becoming people who reflect the love of Jesus.

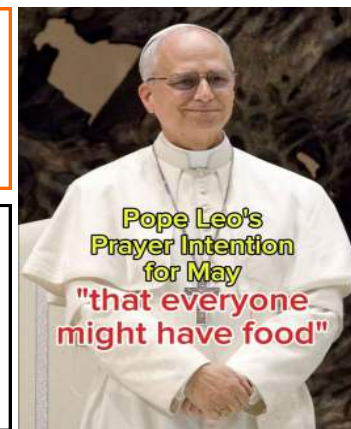
