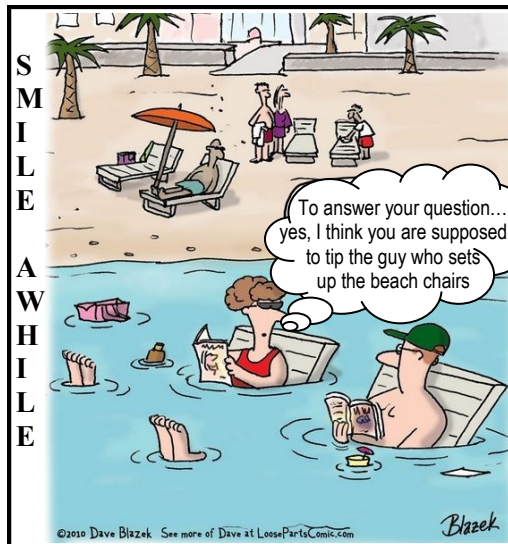

Trinity Sunday

Trinity Sunday invites us to reflect on the mystery at the heart of our faith: one God in three Persons — Father, Son and Holy Spirit. While the Trinity can seem difficult to understand, today's readings remind us that the Trinity is not just a doctrine to explain but a relationship of love into which we are invited.



In the Gospel, Gospel of John tells us: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." These words reveal the depth of God's love for humanity. God does not stand far away from us. The Father sends the Son to save us, and the Holy Spirit remains with us to guide and strengthen us each day.

In the first reading, God reveals himself to Moses as a God of compassion, patience and faithfulness. This is the God we worship - not harsh or distant, but loving and merciful.

The Trinity also teaches us how to live. The love shared between Father, Son and Spirit is perfect unity. We are called to reflect that love in our homes, workplaces and communities through forgiveness, kindness and service.

As we make the Sign of the Cross this week, may we remember that we are blessed in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
