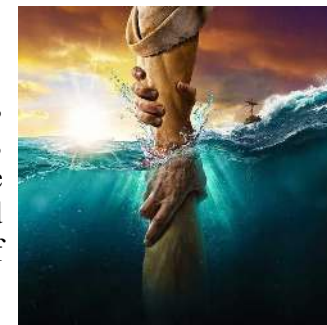

“Do not be afraid.”

This week's readings focus on courage, trust, and faith in God's loving care. In the Gospel, Jesus repeatedly tells His disciples, “Do not be afraid.” These words offer reassurance that God is always present, even during times of difficulty, uncertainty, or opposition.



The message highlights the value of every person in God's eyes. Jesus reminds His followers that God knows them completely and cares for them deeply. This understanding encourages believers to place their trust in God rather than allowing fear to control their lives. In a world where people often worry about failure, rejection, or the opinions of others, the Gospel calls Christians to remain faithful and confident in God's protection.

The readings also acknowledge that following Christ can involve challenges and sacrifices. Living according to Christian values may sometimes be unpopular or difficult. However, Jesus encourages perseverance, assuring His disciples that God's truth and love will ultimately prevail. Courage is not the absence of fear but the decision to remain faithful despite it.

The central lesson of this week is clear: faith in God overcomes fear. Through trust, courage, and perseverance, believers can live as faithful disciples and share God's love with the world.
