## A Cup of Cold Water

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks words that are both challenging and life-giving. He reminds us that discipleship is not simply about believing in him but about placing him at the very centre of our lives. Love for Christ does not diminish our love for family or friends; rather, it orders every relationship according to God's love.




Jesus also tells us that even the smallest act of kindness has great value in God's eyes. Offering a cup of cold water to someone in need may seem insignificant, yet it becomes a sign of God's kingdom when done with love. Our daily opportunities to welcome, encourage, forgive, and serve are the places where holiness is found.

The First Reading, from Second Book of Kings, shows the hospitality of the woman of Shunem, whose generous welcome of Elisha becomes a channel of God's blessing. Her example reminds us that opening our hearts and homes to others allows God to work through us in unexpected ways.

As we gather around the Eucharistic table today, we ask for the courage to put Christ first in every decision and every relationship. May we recognise him in those we meet, serve him with joyful hearts, and never underestimate the transforming power of even the smallest act of love offered in his name.

### Feast Days this Week

**Monday 29th June:** *Ss Peter and Paul, Apostles.*

*On the day traditionally considered in pagan Rome to be the foundation day by Romulus, we celebrate the twin founders of the Church in Rome. St Peter, originally called Simon, a fisherman who became leader of the apostles and the rock on which the Church is built, died by crucifixion around the year 64. St Paul, Saul, the Pharisee who became the 'Apostle of the Gentiles', was martyred by beheading around 67. Both proclaim with their lives that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God.*

**Wednesday 1st July:** *St Oliver Plunkett, bishop & martyr.*

**Friday 3rd July:** *St Thomas, Apostle.*

*St Thomas is said to have preached the gospel in India where he was martyred.*
