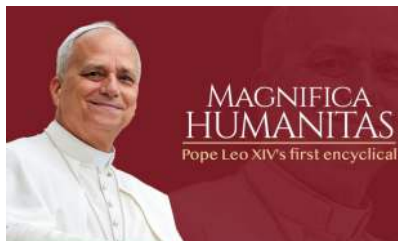
Website of the Week

The readings for this Sunday offer a message of patience, hope, and trust in God's loving presence. Saturday 25th: St James, Apostle

St James the Greater, one of the Apostles is
believed to have preached Christianity in the
Iberian Peninsula before returning to Jerusalem,
where he was martyred around AD 44.

According to legend, his followers carried his
remains by boat to Galicia in northwestern
Spain, where they were buried. Centuries later,
a hermit named Pelayo saw mysterious lights or
a field of stars shining over a remote hillside.

On investigation a stone tomb believed to
contain the remains of St James the Greater and two of his disciples was
discovered leading to the founding of Santiago de Compostela. This
sacred site became one of Christianity's most important pilgrimage
destinations, inspiring the Camino de Santiago, a network of pilgrimage
routes travelled by millions seeking faith, reflection, and adventure.
