Parents wishing for their children to receive First Confession, First Holy Communion and Confirmation in Sallynoggin 2027 **must** register their intent on the parish website.

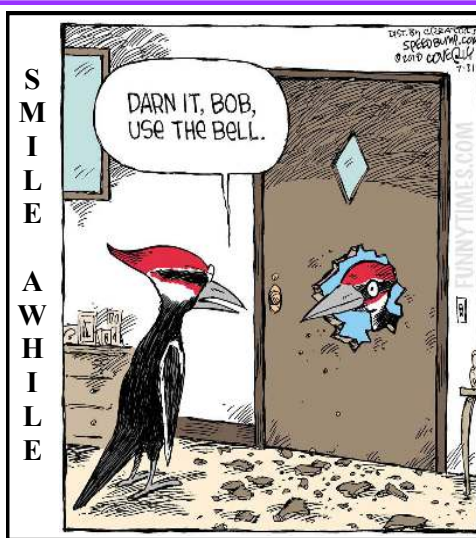

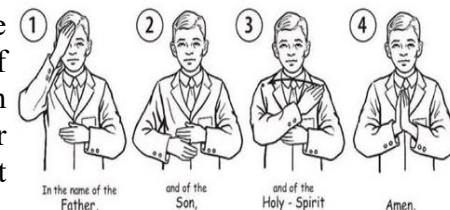

The Sign of the Cross

The Sign of the Cross is one of the simplest and most recognisable prayers of the Catholic faith. When made with devotion it reminds Catholics of their baptism, their redemption through Christ and their belonging to the Holy Trinity



As Catholics we make the Sign of the Cross, saying: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." The right hand is placed on the forehead, then brought to the breast, followed by the left shoulder and then the right shoulder. The movement forms the shape of a cross over the body.

The words proclaim belief in the Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – while the gesture recalls the Cross on which Jesus gave his life for the salvation of the world. Together, the words and movement express the heart of Christian faith: belief in God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and trust in the saving death and resurrection of Jesus.

Catholics make the Sign of the Cross at the beginning and end of prayer, when entering and leaving church, and at important moments during Mass. It can also be made at other times as a quiet prayer of faith, asking for God's presence, protection and blessing.

A small gesture, made with faith, can therefore become a powerful reminder: God is with us.
